Brendan has graduated from Sapulpa High School and has accepted an offer to attend The University of Tulsa (TU) to pursue a double major of Political Science and History, with a minor in Creative Writing and a certificate in journalism. While in college, he is looking forward to studying abroad in Dublin, Ireland. And his career goal is to become a political journalist.

We can't thank you enough for all the assistance you gave our family while Brendan was at We Care. Although he was only there for a short time, we believe that the language, social and motor skills he learned helped set him up for his success in mainstream public school.

Brendan's sister Danielle is graduating from TU this year with a degree in Exercise and Sports Science. She is going to occupational therapy school next year and plans to work with children with disabilities. She chose this profession after seeing the progress her brother made

with the help of occupational and physical therapy.

My husband and I still donate to We Care, and we highly recommend it to any family in need of your services. With the foundation that We Care helped him build, Brendan was able to overcome many obstacles, graduate from high school, and enroll in a 4-year university.

Meet Volunteer Kim Tsutsui

As president of her own company for over 20 years, Kim provided business consulting and senior-level project management services to many financial institutions.

In 2001, with some free time on her hands and wanting to give back to her community, Kim did a search on "at-risk teens" and curiously, We Care Services for Children came up.

Thinking "Wow, that sure sounds familiar," she realized she drove by the school every single day! Turns out that Kim lived up the street, so her story begins with literally walking down the block, filling out an application, getting a TB shot and fingerprinted!

She soon became a part-time classroom volunteer for three days a week with the Explorers program. She worked that year with 18 children aged 18 months to 3 years, and saw first-hand what a life-changing experience We Care's early intervention could be for them.

"I watched many graduate," Kim remembers, "while shedding a few tears of joy along with their parents. The families were filled with incredible hope and gratitude for such an important, necessary start for their children's futures."

Kim joined We Care's board of directors and was one of our longest-serving members (2002 – 2012). Then fast forward, and after she retired from her consulting business last year, she returned once more as a volunteer. She now supports the board and management team on a wide range of projects, assisting with strategic goals and planning.
