

### A Light at the End of the Tunnel

"Casey" came to our Mental Health program two years ago at the age of three. She had been recently placed in foster care because of severe abuse and neglect in her family.

Casey's new foster parents knew they were taking on a lot of issues because of her history. But with two children of their own, they felt they could offer the right environment to a child who had experienced significant trauma due to a lack of basic physical and emotional support.


Also, much of Casey's ways of playing and relating to children led our therapists to suspect there had been other types of abuse in her family of origin. It became clear that without therapy, the reasons for her behavior wouldn't be fully understood or changed.

So Casey's foster parents were referred to our high-risk foster placement program. Casey received an intensive assessment of history-gathering and observation. Her therapist met with the new family to determine their goals and needs, and begin the best path of treatment.

Because of Casey's age and specific needs, We Care set up parallel tracks of support:

 One track was individual sessions with Casey in a room with her foster parents where they played together. As issues came up that reflected parts of her trauma, the parents had the opportunity to understand and address them in real time.

These were the same issues that were coming up at home – aggression, issues with "attaching," and sexualized behavior. But with the therapist in the room, the family learned that there were even better approaches than ones that felt intuitive. The therapist modeled and taught consistency, calm, and ways to create a bond that Casey had never experienced in her life.

### **Mission Statement**

Through targeted, compassionate, and effective early intervention services, We Care helps young children and their families reach their full potential, regardless of their abilities or circumstances.

 The other track was meeting with the foster parents alone, and giving them space to express their fears, doubts and questions. These sessions gave them an opportunity to discuss and understand Casey's likely past, and to give them hope.

As part of the therapy, the foster parents learned how their parenting styles could be adjusted to work well with a wider range of behaviors, and to keep Casey's greater needs from impacting their other children's needs for support and attention.

Throughout this process, Casey's symptoms became more and more manageable. The improvement wasn't always in a straight line, but every slip brought new insight and more determination to see this through. We Care always provided a light at the end of the tunnel.

Today, treatment is complete and Casey is in preschool and thriving. There are still times when aspects of the trauma reappear, but the family knows what to do - and they do it.

And last month, they adopted Casey officially in a wonderful ceremony that their We Care therapist attended.

Casey is home.
