

Growing Together with We Care's Developmental Playgroups

For years, We Care's Developmental Playgroups have been transforming lives by fostering meaningful connections between parents and children. These playgroups, held at First 5 Centers and led by Early Childhood Specialist Lupe Henriquez and Playgroup Teacher Associate Monica Granados, provide a special environment where children and parents learn and grow together through play.

Offered weekly for eight weeks, each 1.5-hour session includes interactive activities that enhance language, social skills, problemsolving, and motor coordination. Beyond these developmental benefits, the playgroups are a space where caregivers can bond with their children and learn how to support their progress.

We are exceptionally proud of these playgroups, as they fill a void in the community by offering support and guidance for caregivers of children with developmental delays who have not received the diagnosis needed to qualify for typical resources and services. This support is evident during the sessions where parents are not simply observers but active participants. As one parent shared, "The services gave Tommy and me one-on-one time, and provided tools to use at home to help improve his overall growth."

Children's progress through the playgroups speaks volumes about their effectiveness. Jessica's mom noted, "The playgroups have given Jessica more confidence. Following directions has improved and it has enhanced her hand-eye coordination."

Another parent's experience highlights the practical skills children gain. "My child is now better at following directions and has learned good table manners. He can put on his shoes, zip up his jacket, and even use a spray bottle. I have a better understanding of how to support his growth at home."

Inspired by successful programs at institutions like San Francisco General Hospital and UCSF, our initiative fills a crucial gap in Contra Costa County by providing these essential services to expectant mothers. We offer comprehensive mental health assessments, therapeutic interventions, psychoeducation, and resource referrals tailored to each mother's specific needs. Post-birth, our services transition seamlessly to address the mental health needs of both the child and the mother if required.

We Care's Perinatal Mental Health Pilot Program represents a monumental step in expanding our efforts to reach many of the most vulnerable members of our community. By addressing issues such as depression, anxiety, and trauma early, we help establish a solid foundation for a healthy and happy future for both mother and baby, regardless of the challenges they face.
